Foxboro Cable Access, Inc. (FCA) is a non-profit organization established in 1982 as part of the License Agreement between the Town of Foxborough and Cablevision Industries, the franchise operator at the time. The License Agreement gave FCA the authority to establish rules for the use of the facilities, equipment, and channels provided by the cable franchise companies, now Comcast Corporation and Verizon. All cable subscribers in Foxboro are included as voting members of the Foxboro Cable Access corporation.

The corporation is managed by a nine member volunteer Board of Directors. Seven members are elected by the membership, while two are appointed by the Select Board.



The FCA Board of Directors operates under the FCA Corporate Bylaws, revised in January, 2018. A copy of the by-laws is kept on file at the FCA Office at 28 Central Street in Foxborough. The Board elects officers and the President appoints volunteer operating positions from time to time as required to help manage the operation. The equipment and facilities provided for public access television are used by numerous trained individuals from the Foxborough community. Acting independently as volunteers, they produce programs of their choice which are cablecast to the community on the local public access channels, 8, 12 and 22 for Comcast subscribers, and on channels 39, 37 and 38 for Verizon subscribers.

FCA MISSION STATEMENT

To empower Foxborough citizens,

government and educational institutions to communicate through media To manage an electronic forum for the free exchange

of ideas and information, and

To promote its use by providing access to media-making tools and educations.

To this end, Foxboro Cable Access has established and maintains satellite cablecast facilities in thirteen community locations in addition to the main studio and mobile production unit.



Communication Arts Classroom Suite at FHS Media Center

Located on the 2nd floor of the FHS Media Center in two adjacent, interconnected rooms, this facility is equipped with 4 cameras, green screen, SEG, graphics, audio console & microphones, computers for editing and options for live fiber transmission.

St. Mary's Church, Bethany Church, and Union Church

Each facility is equipped with multicamera console with audio options and recording capability for worship services. Post Production editing is done by Video Ministry volunteers at FCA's Central Street Studio.

Ahern Broadcasting Center

First established in 2010 and upgraded to HD in 2018, it is equipped with camera, audio and graphic equipment with studio desk for broadcasting *"The Daily* 2" a student-run daily news to each classroom. This well-attended cocurricular afterschool activity is supervised by a faculty advisor.

Government Meeting Rooms at Town Hall & FHS Media Center

Equipped with 5 robotic cameras, SEG, graphics, audio sources, options for remote participation and/or live fiber transmission, and digital recording of Select Board meetings and School Committee meetings.

Main Studio & Control Room

Equipped with multi-camera capability, several audio sources, graphics, Special Effects Generator, lighting grid and gobos, and options for remote Zoom guest via live fiber transmission or recording of talk shows, demonstrations or other events.

Mobile Studio

Brand new 2022 Ford F450 chassis and engine with customized features, previously upgraded "box" with HD rack-mounted equipment and add'l hard wired cameras, video replay, SEG, graphics, audio sources, generator, and options for live fiber transmission or recording of sporting or other community events.



TV Center at FHS Gym

Equipped with 4-5 camera capability, video replay, SEG, graphics, audio sources, options for live fiber transmission or recording of sporting events, graduation, class night or other events.

Marilyn Rodman PAC

After years of making do with temporary production control equipment at the Orpheum Theater, in 2018 we finally set up a VERY compact, permanent recording console using a corner of the projection booth and a few seats in the back row. The versatile multi-camera arrangement makes it much easier to capture the variety of theatrical performances or large musical events that are held there.





TV Center at FHS Auditorium

Equipped with 11 - 13 camera capability, SEG, graphics, audio sources, options for live fiber transmission or recording of school concerts, meetings or other events.

Cablecast Console at Boyden Library Community Meeting Room

Equipped with 4 robotic camera capability, SEG, graphics, audio sources, options for live fiber transmission or recording of meetings, programs or presentations by Foxborough Historical Society.



FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ...

Dear Community Members,

I am pleased to present the FCA Annual Report for our PEG (Public, Educational, and Government) access TV station. This past year has been an exciting and productive one for our station, and I am proud of all that we have accomplished together.

One of the highlights of the year was the deployment of a new automated playback system in April. That same month Comcast activated a High Definition (HD) Channel (Comcast 1072), allowing our community programming to be viewed in its original HD format. Once the Verizon license renewal is complete, as is expected in early 2023, we will begin the process of formally requesting an HD PEG Channel for Verizon FiOS customers.

The playback system upgrades made it possible to start offering closed-captioning for select programming ... a very big step towards meeting the needs of EVERYONE in our community. While cost remains a factor, we fully expect to expand our closed-captioning services in 2023.

Indexing government meetings was another incremental step forward this year. In April, Deb Wendell began logging our government meetings with clickable timestamps, making it possible for viewers on our VOD website or youtube.com to find and jump to sections of meeting videos easily. The feedback has been very positive and appreciative.

In total, community volunteers produced 507 locally produced programs in 2022. That includes 395 LIVE programs! Community engagement and viewership remain strong on our PEG channels and our online platforms. The FCA YouTube Channel reached 6,997 subscribers by year-end, with 239,300 views during the year.

Our building sustained damage from a car accident in 2021, and after many delays, the repairs were completed in February 2022.

In addition to the repairs made to the building's facade, we also improved the rear interior entrance, adding stair treads and railings. On the outside, we repaired and repainted the rear wall of the building and replaced two large rooftop HVAC units.





Major upgrades to our Mobile Unit production truck also took place this year. The "box" section of the truck was removed and placed onto a brand new 2022 Ford F450 truck, bringing new life to a 22-year-old asset. This custom strategy allowed us to maximize the investments in HD equipment and configurations that have been made over the previous 10 years. A new generator, paint job, and roof rails were also installed to make the truck safe and reliable.

While the truck was being worked on, FCA volunteers did not stop or even slow production. During the early part of the Fall, we rented a U-haul truck for football season, and a temporary control room was actually built in the truck several weeks in a row to maintain our normal high production value coverage.

During the Thanksgiving Day Football coverage, with our new truck, volunteer Frank Giffune announced that he will retire from the Warrior Broadcast Booth after 18 years. Doug Suess took a few minutes at the end of the game to reflect on Frank's contributions through many seasons and MANY weather conditions. Frank said, *"It's been a great pleasure to work with everyone,"* and offered his best wishes for continued success. In July, FCA was honored by the Select Board for supporting Town Government during the pandemic. Select Board member Mark Elfman said, "It was truly a remarkable thing you guys did during the COVID pandemic — it was above and beyond what anybody could have asked." going on to say, "It just seemed to me you had the ability to pivot on a dime, for us to be able to hold remote meetings, have remote access, and get business done while keeping our employees and our residents safe."

Public Policy remains a threat both at the state and national levels. We continue to monitor legislative

activities and keep our elected officials aware of our needs and the positive impacts PEG Access offers on communities. Thankfully there have been no major legislative changes in 2022 that have negatively impacted our operations. That said, "cord-cutting" continues to have an impact on funding, which is an ongoing concern.

You can learn more about these topics and many more inside the pages of this Annual Report.

I want to thank the FCA Board of Directors, who work tirelessly for the organization for the support they offer all year long. I'm thankful for a wonderful staff that supports our mission every day. Most importantly, we express gratitude to the FCA volunteers who contribute countless hours to produce local programming. Your efforts have been instrumental in making our organization valued and respected within our local community, and also in the wider media landscape.

We are grateful for the support of our town and its residents. It's been essential to our success. FCA has a long history of serving the Foxborough community, providing a platform for diverse and independent voices as well as citizen engagement. From the early days of analog broadcasting to its current state-of-the-art High Definition digital platform, FCA has continually adapted to meet community needs, and plans to continue that standard well into the future.

PRODUCTION

Production schedules and routines gradually returned to normal following two years of the COVID pandemic. As restrictions eased and more people became vaccinated, the community resumed more regular operations. Audiences and spectators returned to events and our production crews could be fully staffed with volunteers.

Maintaining and supporting our 13 production facilities is an ongoing challenge. Nearly all facilities in recent years have been upgraded to High Definition; the production facility located within the High School Auditorium was the last remaining Standard Defenition system.

FHS AUDITORIUM

In January 2022, Paul Beck spent two weeks cleaning and reconfiguring the TV Center at Foxborough High School, a full featured production facility in the auditorium. This major project had been on a long hiatus due to the pandemic. A large assortment of older analog equipment was discarded. These As part of the January cleanup, five donated Ikegami HK-388W camera systems were installed replacing older cameras. These newer cameras can operate in the wide-screen 16x9 aspect ratio which is common for all current television production. The older "legacy" format of Standard Definition television was 4x3 aspect. Two of these more modern studio cameras were used for the Spring POPS concerts at the FHS Gym. They were intercut with our full-HD cameras for the concert, and folks were pleased with the wide-screen images.

The consensus is that this concept of covering musical or staged events in the 16x9 wide screen format works quite well for us. It has been a great learning experience and growth step for higher production values as we transition to a planned fully High Definition telecasting facility at the FHS Auditorium.

This experimentation continued into February 2023 where two FHS concerts were broadcast live and recorded with twelve cameras, all operating in the 16x9 wide-screen mode. The consensus is that this concept of covering musical or staged events in the 16x9 wide screen format works quite well for us. It has been a great learning experience and growth step for higher production values as we transition to a

planned fully High Definition telecasting facility at the FHS Auditorium. Detailed conceptual drawings of the planned upgrades were created in 2022 and discussions with the primary users are ongoing.

MOBILE UNIT The FCA Mobile Unit is a highly visible core production asset used to cover

countless community events since it was acquired in June 2000. "The Cable 8 Truck" as some refer to it, has

items were no longer needed and WELL past their useful life. The TV Center at FHS is a permanently installed facility comprised of 90% donated

equipment from regional broadcast stations and networks. All are high-end Standard Definition broadcast equipment that now serves the FCA Community with "second life." These assets have supported telecasts originating from the FHS Auditorium for over 10 years. Paul Beck and a crew of dedicated volunteers have provided ongoing engineering support and maintenance along with frequent "mini" upgrades as new donations become available.



PRODUCTION

become a symbol of our organization out in the community. Only the second vehicle in our history, the 2000 Ford truck replaced the original 1984 Ford Econoline van in which we had crammed with multiple upgrades of racks and gear.

Twenty-one years is well beyond any reasonably expected lifespan and as expected, technicians identified some concerns with the truck frame and other mechanical issues in 2020-21. After extensive discussion, a creative and cost-saving solution was devised to replace the Ford truck, while retaining the "Ctrl Rm Box" part of the truck, which included the configurations of production equipment and transfer it onto a new Ford chassis.

The truck was taken offline in late 2021 while work was being performed by Accelerated Media in Auburn, MA. Beyond the "box" transfer, other improvements were made at the same time, including:



- A Roof Rail System / Exterior Painting
- New Flooring in the production area
- New interior and exterior LED Lighting
- Power reconfigurations
- New I/O Connector Panel
- New Generator, Air Conditioner

Despite supply chain and labor issues, the work was completed successfully. The new truck arrived in October 2022, midway thru the Fall Sports season. It is now better equipped than ever to serve the community and help FCA achieve its mission.

KEEP MOVING FORWARD

Overcoming challenges is a hallmark of success. At the outset of the Football season, our team faced a significant hurdle as volunteers stepped up to cover the production with our Mobile Unit still offsite and offline. However, through the collective expertise of our volunteers and staff, we were able to assemble portable equipment and load it into a rented Uhaul truck, which served as a temporary production facility. Thanks to the dedication and hard work of our team, we were able to maintain the high standards of production that we are known for. Despite the challenges, we successfully supported 5-6 cameras, instant replay, graphics, and live streaming. There is always a profound sense of pride when we surmount obstacles and challenges. However, there was also a palpable sense of relief and appreciation when our "real" Mobile Unit returned in late October, enabling us to complete the season with all our regular equipment.

A similar challenge occurred months earlier with our largest production of the year: the annual POPS Concert. This weekend-long event involves students from the High School music department transforming the gymnasium into a concert hall and performing two three-hour concerts in two days. For 30 years now, FCA has partnered with the students to provide stage lighting, TV coverage, and voiceover announcements to support the performances. Hours of planning and preparations go into this event each year, including 12-15 hours of setup and testing Friday and Saturday before the first concert. This year, due to scheduling conflicts, that setup time was cut down to less than 6 hours. This required some creative planning and logistics and resulted in another success for FCA volunteers.

FACILITIES & EQUIPMENT

MARILYN RODMAN PERFORMING ARTS CENTER

This local entertainment venue has been increasing its activity levels over the past years, and FCA has been covering events on a regular basis with portable equipment. In 2018, three state-of-the-art PTZ cameras, 6 x 8 sq. ft of space was carved out of the projection booth to house dedicated video and audio equipment capable of recording multi camera theatrical performances. This is the thirteenth satellite production center that has been build around town to facilitate coverage of community events .

SCHOOL SUPPORT

Perhaps FCA's longest running collaboration is with Foxborough Public Schools. Since 1984, students have had the opportunity to take a full credit elective course in Communiction Arts. Although the class did not run in the Fall of 2022, it is designed to provide hands-on training in state-of-the-art studio, control room and digital production facilities, as well as message making, script development and media literacy.

The Ahern Broadcasting Club (ABC) continues to produce "The Daily 2" morning news show shown to students LIVE! over the school's closed-circuit TV network. ABC advisor Dan Williams has been at the helm since the beginning in 2010 and has been instrumental in its growth.

FIRE DEPARTMENT DOCUMENTARY

This special program tells the unique and unusual story of Foxboro's first white fire apparatus. FCA reached out to Town Historian Jack Authelet about

the project and he provided details of the early days of local Fire Service and our town's penchant for the white vehicles. We were fortunate to have an intern from Bridgewater State College available to work with us on the project. Jennifer Krentzman coordinated the shooting schedules and completed the final editing. Fire Dept. Captain Andrew Puntini was excited to collaborate with us on the project and very appreciative of the opportunity to document another slice of local history. "The documentary was focused on our 1938 Ahren Fox, which was Engine 2. It was the Town's first white fire truck and we have been that way since. It was found in Michigan and donated back to the Town. It needs extensive repair.

Our other antique is the 1928 Maxim, Engine 1. We reacquired it from a retired firefighter and we finished the restoration in house. It is currently running and driving and in good shape."

COMCAST HD CHANNEL

We strive to fill our channels with interesting, relevant content and to make the public aware of the many ways they can view it. Master Control, which is the origination point for all thee PEG channels, internal networking components, our new HD Channel as well as our live-streaming equipment, required major upgrades to maximize the new cablecasting potential of closed captioning and high definition.

FCA RADIO

Dave Udden continues to prepare weekly local news updates which are also cablecast on the audio track of the Government Channel. The new automated audio equipment allows him to expand the news format to include music, bumpers, channel IDs and really personalize the information with special holiday greetings from local personalities.

PROGRAMMING

PUBLIC ACCESS CHANNELS 8 & 39

Features programs produced by local volunteers along with outside programming that is sponsored by local residents.

EDUCATION CHANNELS 12 & 37

Features LIVE coverage of regular and special meetings of the Foxborough School Committee continued in 2014. Programming from the US Department of Education and NASA is also cablecast, along with repeat playback of school sports and music programs. **Classic Arts Showcase** plays overnight daily. Public service announcements regarding Foxborough Public Schools and other area schools, The Boyden Library, and Foxborough YMCA are played around the clock.

GOVERNMENT CHANNELS 22 & 38

Features LIVE coverage of Select Board and other official town meetings are cablecast here, along with first run and repeat programming from the Senior Center/Council on Aging, and Foxborough's Historical Commission and Historical Society. This is the main location to find information regarding town meetings, town departments, community events and local non-profit organizations.

COMMUNITY BULLETIN BOARD

Announcements from local government agencies, educational institutions and regional non-profit organizations are cablecast daily, in addition to Activated Emergency Cancellations and Election Information.

COMMUNITY RESOURCES

FCA SOCIAL MEDIA

We continue to promote FCA through our website, Facebook, Twitter and You Tube channel. Town residents and officials alike have applauded our ability to livestream multiple meetings and events to the internet, often simultaneously across various media platforms.

The FCA website continues to be a major community outreach effort, providing ready access to general information, program schedule, production calendar and forms. FCA's presence on Face-

book, Instagram and Twitter is another great opportunity for community interaction and is used to update information frequently especially during periods of activity, such as emergency conditions, high interest sporting events or public meetings.

BUILDING IMPROVEMENTS

Repairs to the front of the building were completed early in the spring of 2022. Because the auto accident in fall of 2021 caused structural damage to the brick wall and window frames, access to the lobby area was restricted pending completion. It wasn't too long before conversations started about rebuilding the train layout. Ideas to expand the display led to discussions on other improvements to the lobby and entrance area which will be done in 2023.

The Foxborough Central Railway has quite a following among the passers-by at 28 Central St. As the year rolled around, our favorite Chief Engineer managed to produce a whole new assortment of "G" scale garden train stock and layout accessories, many of them with moving parts and whimsical holiday themes. This *temporary* layout still draws regular attention as fans await the new expanded display. We really appreciate all the concern expressed by the community, most especially the ones who helped crawl under the table to disengage the multitude of wires that connected power to the crossing gates, railroad buildings and village houses, dismantling the platform and packing the trains away for safe keeping and temporary storage.

Meanwhile, the 17 year-old HVAC units on building were due for a major upgrade and that was also accomplished in 2022.

COMMUNITY RESOURCES



JAMES R. ELLSWORTH MEMORIAL MVP TROPHY Early in the 2000s, the Board of Directors created this award in recognition of our well loved past president, a football fan who directed our local game coverage for many years. The striking cus-

tom-designed trophy stands 18" tall with the names of 15 recipients engraved on brass plates. When additional space was needed, we added a 6" riser base. This year, we designate a special spot on the front of the riser to recognize high achievement among announcers.

FCA SCHOLARSHIP

Since 1985, FCA has presented 40 scholarships to local town residents who are pursuing higher education in the field of Communications . There were no applicants in 2022.

FALL COOKOUT & HOLIDAY SOCIAL

Volunteers welcomed the opportunity to get together in a casual atmosphere at these favorite annual events. After two years of limited interaction among our volunteers, everyone was anxious to re-instate our traditional holiday gathering. We took advantage of several great local options for catering, put together "goody bags" for the volunteers and their families, and enjoyed a wonderful afternoon catching up in the holiday spirit.

PROFESSIONAL AFFILIATIONS

FCA continues to maintain memberships in various regional and national media organizations such as the Alliance for Community Media, MassAccess, and SMPTE (Society of Motion Picture Engineers) as well as local and regional business associations, Tri-Town Chamber of Commerce and the Foxborough Common Business Collaborative.

In todays challenging media climate, it is even more important to promote Foxboro Cable Access and its vital role in the local community. Our prominent location on Central Street gives us great visibility and numerous visitors drop in frequently to inquire about what we do here, how they can become involved or to see our wonderful train layout. We continued our increased presence in local print media through additional press releases on pertinent topics and paid advertisements in *The Foxboro Reporter*, in the Mail-A-Map program, and sponsored page in the Foxborough Business Almanac.
