Foxboro Cable Access, Inc. (FCA) is a non-profit organization established in 1982 as part of the License Agreement between the Town of Foxborough and Cablevision Industries, the franchise operator at the time. The License Agreement gave FCA the authority to establish rules for the use of the facilities, equipment, and channels provided by the cable franchise companies, now Comcast Corporation and Verizon. All cable subscribers in Foxboro are included as voting members of the Foxboro Cable Access corporation.

The corporation is managed by a nine member volunteer Board of Directors. Seven members are elected by the membership, while two are appointed by the Select Board. The FCA Board of Directors operates under the FCA Corporate Bylaws, revised in January 2018. A copy of the by-laws is kept on file at the FCA Office at 28 Central Street in Foxborough. The Board elects officers and the President appoints volunteer operating positions from time to time as required to help manage the operation. The equipment and facilities provided for public access television are used by numerous trained individuals from the Foxborough community. Acting independently as volunteers, they produce programs of their choice which are cablecast to the community on the local public access channels, 8, 6, 22 & 1072 HD for Comcast subscribers, and on channels 39, 37, 38 & 2139 HD for Verizon.

FCA MISSION STATEMENT

To empower Foxborough citizens,

To this end, Foxboro Cable Access has established and maintains satellite cablecast facilities in thirteen community locations in addition to the main studio and mobile production unit.



Communication Arts Classroom Suite at FHS Media Center

Located on the 2nd floor of the FHS Media Center in two adjacent, interconnected rooms, this facility is equipped with 4 cameras, green screen, SEG, graphics, audio console & microphones, computers for editing and options for live fiber transmission.

St. Mary's Church, Bethany Church, and Union Church

Each facility is equipped with multicamera console with audio options and recording capability for worship services. Post Production editing is done by Video Ministry volunteers at FCA's

Ahern Broadcasting Center

First established in 2010 and upgraded to HD in 2018, it is equipped with camera, audio and graphic equipment with studio desk for broadcasting "The Daily 2" a student-run daily news to each classroom. This well-attended co-curricular afterschool activity is supervised by a faculty advisor.

Government Meeting Room at Town Hall

Equipped with 6 robotic cameras, SEG, graphics, audio sources, options for remote participation and/or live fiber transmission, and digital recording of meetings of the Select Board, School Committee, Planning Board and others.

Main Studio & Control Room

Equipped with multi-camera capability, several audio sources, graphics, Special Effects Generator, lighting grid, and options for guests remotely via Zoom for live broadcast or future editing. We hve a large assortment of set décor and greenscreen options.

Mobile Studio

2022 Ford F450 chassis and engine with customized features, previously upgraded "box" with HD rackmounted equipment and add'l hard wired cameras, video replay, SEG, graphics, audio sources, generator, and options for live fiber transmission or recording of sporting or other community events?



TV Center at FHS Gym

Equipped with 4-5 camera capability, video replay, SEG, graphics, audio sources, options for live fiber transmission or recording of sporting events, graduation, class night or other events.



TV Center at FHS Auditorium

Equipped with 12 camera capability, SEG, graphics, audio sources, options for live fiber transmission or recording of school concerts, meetings or events.

Marilyn Rodman PAC

After years of making do with temporary production control equipment at the Orpheum Theater, in 2018 we finally set up a VERY compact, permanent recording console using a corner of the projection booth .The versatile multi-camera arrangement makes it much easier to capture the variety of theatrical performances or large musical events that are held there.

PRODUCTION

FCA volunteers were busy in 2024, producing an average of 10 programs per week, totaling 546 locallyproduced shows! This is a remarkable number when you consider the amount of time it takes to plan, execute, and publish one program. Each expressing thoughts, ideas, events, and spotlighting different aspects of our community.

FCA embraces the philosophy of its slogan Local Programming, By & About People YOU Know! It highlights the fact that our programs are focused on our local community, unlike regional and nation commercial networks. A local Cub Scout Pack was an example of such a collaboration. They came in for a tour of our studios and did a promo for their annual Pancake Breakfast which was played on our channels.

SMALL CREW, BIG IMPACT

We often don't highlight or talk about some of the smaller productions and events covered at the Boyden Library and Marilyn Rodman Performing Arts Center (MRPAC). Both locations have multi-camera robotic cameras and control consoles that permit a single operator to execute professional level production for air on the local channels. Although the entire production can be handled by a single volunteer, it does require a high level of video production experience, quick creative thinking, and the ability to maintain your wits.

We're lucky to have several volunteers willing and able to step into these solo missions. Over the years folks like Paul Godin, Lauren Bitar, and Paul Beck have honed their skills in this area, producing hun-

dreds of programs. Vin Riccio stepped forward and has become our primary volunteer for event coverage at the Boyden Library Community Room, producing programs like "Boyden Sunday Concerts Series" and other special

events.

CONTRACT PRODUCTION

It was a high tribute for FCA to be asked to cover graduation exercises at Stonehill College several years ago on a contract basis, and they've continued to request our services. This year, they hosted a Post-Presidential Election Forum from their auditorium.

The crew of our local news program "What's Up?" has been busy all year producing short segments about various local events and activities. Under the direction and mentorship of Juri Love, the group has done numerous short interviews with local organizers, residents and occasionally at remote locations, always looking to empower youth with opportunities to learn and grow. The young reporters are becoming a familiar sight around town in their blue FCA Crew shirts and their hard work on the series is an inspiration to others.

THE FCA TV CENTER AT FHS

FCA embarked on a significant capital project this year to upgrade the FHS Auditorium Production Facility. An effort that has been in the planning stages for several years and coincides with the twentieth anniversary of the original project proposal for the original system in 2004. Over the summer, work began on this seven-month project to completely rebuild the facility with state-of-the-art high-definition equipment, enhancing the FHS TV Center's capabilities for live broadcasting.

Looking back, it's remarkable how far we've come from the days when volunteers were required to use the FCA TV Truck for every production at the auditorium. The original concept for an in-house facility was an idea brought on by a large lot of equipment donated 20 years ago. Today, the facility has become a critical asset for FCA.

Originating from a grassroots effort, the facility and its history are truly unique. Much of the success of the original project can be attributed to the vision and resources provided by Paul Beck. Paul is known to have countless industry contacts and has developed a reputation for soliciting equipment donations in support of his many philanthropic projects, including video systems for local churches and FCA. Back then, Paul always kept his van gassed up and ready to race off to pick up gear anytime the phone rang with a donation opportunity.

In 2004, the collection of equipment Paul acquired was growing, mostly high-end gear from various donors who were upgrading their own equipment and choosing to donate their decommissioned equipment. Donors included WCVB-TV, WGBH-TV, WHDH-TV, Emerson College, National Boston, Active Video, and others. With equipment in hand, Paul started on a proposal for the High School Auditorium, one of the locations where FCA

covered events frequently. The concept was to create an affordable, high-end production facility within the school's auditorium, utilizing the donated equipment for a near zero -cost build-out. Once built, the truck and the hours of setup for every event would no longer be necessary.

During the planning stages, the facility was referred to as the FHS Teleproduction Facility, but it eventually became known as the "FCA TV Center at FHS." Following a green light from the FCA Board of Directors in 2004, the

equipment gathering and testing began almost immediately. The Foxborough School Dept also offered its full support, approving the concept, and afforded FCA space for a control room on the high school's second floor adjacent to the auditorium. The room was once the home of a school radio station and, years later, the yearbook office.

On May 3, 2008, following several years of hard work by FCA volunteers, the "FCA TV CENTER at FHS" was completed, and a ribbon cutting was held to mark the milestone and success of the project. We will forever be grateful for the efforts of the FCA volunteers who spent countless hours installing the heavy equipment and running camera cables the size of a firehose.

Over the years, the FCA TV Center has received incremental upgrades as donations have been made. In the late 2000s, a second wave of donations became available as high-

definition (HD) Television was starting to make traction, and large broadcast stations began making upgrades as part of the Digital Television (DTV) transition in the United States. As these stations and networks upgraded to digital, FCA was blessed with...surplus equipment! This round of donations allowed FCA to move away from tube cameras and shift to CCD chip cameras, very high-end versions, some of the highest quality SD cameras and lenses ever made! Despite the age of some of the equipment, Paul Beck was able to

keep the system viable and producing great pictures for nearly 20 years. For a short time, the system was even set up to output in 1440x1080 "Alomst HD" rather than 1920x1080 "real HD." Not bad for a shoestring budget!

FHS AUDITORIUM GOES HD

While upgrades to HD were in discussions for several years, 2024 was deemed the right time for a wholesale upgrade. Starting in June 2024, volunteers removed absolutely everything from the control room, and for the first time in twenty years, the room was empty. Cameras were removed from their positions throughout the auditorium, cables pulled out, everything gone.

Thanks again to Paul Beck, many larger items, including cameras, were saved from being scrapped at the TV junkyard. Paul reached out to a friend in Kilgore, Texas, who owns the Texas Broadcast Museum and was thrilled to accept the decommissioned equipment. Breathing yet another new life into equipment long past its expected lifecycle. Paul even rented a box truck and personally delivered the equipment to the Texas Broadcast Museum. Not only that, Paul helped them unpack, set up, and test the gear before flying back home. Oh, and he was featured on the local news as the community celebrated the donation.

With the control room clear and a fresh coat of paint on the walls, the installation of HD equipment began. The

control room went from seven racks down to ONE! A dozen or more analog monitors were replaced with just two 60" wall-mounted HDTVs. Big,




heavy camera cables were replaced with thin, lightweight fiber optic cables. This time, the upgrade required a budget; donations were no longer a viable option for the upgrade we needed to perform. Thankfully, the previous twenty years proved the value of the investment, and the funds were fully supported by the FCA Board as a thankful School Department gave us the green light once again.

The new system was completed in November 2024 and has leaped us into a whole new style of production. Volunteers no longer need to climb catwalk ladders to operate cameras, improving comfort and safety. The small size of the PTZ cameras also allows them to be placed in locations not possible before, including in the middle of a musical performance area. Thanks to some collaboration with the school department, we also installed a fiber cable that connects the new system di-

> rectly to the FCA Studio on Central Street. Utilizing the town's fiber network, we now have a reliable high bandwidth connection for our live broadcasts on the local cable channels and online.

> As of this writing, the new production facility has been used to record more than a half-dozen events and is working well. Over the past 20 years, approximately 480 events have been produced at

the facility, including music concerts, town meetings, dance performances, theater performances, and more. Each one shared live and/or recorded for repeat broadcast. Each event is important for different community segments, captured for keepsakes and history. Some folks have mentioned that the technical upgrades and facilities supporting the Arts, Music, and other Community benefits have enabled the High School Auditorium to serve as our own local "Kennedy Center for The Performing Arts," right here in our town. The FCA Community is pleased and proud to provide this wonderful media asset for everyone in Foxborough.

FACILITIES & EQUIPMENT

BUILDING RENNOVATIONS

FCA undertook two significant building renovation projects aimed at enhancing the functionality and aesthetic appeal of our facility.

Following the car accident that damaged our building several years ago, we reevaluated our interior space with an eye toward the future and opening up the space. We removed a secondary entry vestibule, installed a new window, and added some new brick to extend the window ledge. These changes improve the flow of traffic and create space for an ex-

panded train display in the future. Currently, the lobby now features additional seating and organizational information for visitors.

EXTERIOR FACADE

The exterior of our building also received a major

refresh with the replacement of siding above the front windows and a brand-new awning that spans the length of the building.

MOBILE STUDIO

In 2024, our FCA Mobile Unit Truck continued to serve as a vital asset for capturing community events on the go. Its flexibility and reliability allowed us to cover important events, such as the high school football semifinal game in Plymouth against Hanover last November. While the truck did not undergo major upgrades this year, we have focused on optimizing its existing capabilities and experimenting with innovative solutions to enhance our remote broadcasting capabilities. Notably, we have begun testing the use of Starlink technology to provide internet access and bandwidth for live streaming in locations with limited or no connectivity. This initiative aims to further expand our reach and ensure seamless coverage of events in any setting. The Mobile Unit's value lies in its ability to be ready at a moment's notice and serve the needs of a variety of productions. From public forums to live sports, the truck is READY. As always, experienced volunteers who know how to manage the various systems make every production a success.

PROGRAMMING

We provide multiple viewing options for the community: Programming runs 24 hours daily on three SD channels, 2 HD channels; LIVE! streaming meetings and events on our FCA website (fcatv.org) and YouTube.com; Community Bulletin Board notices and announcements with customized FCA Radio news and local commentary as background; and over 2500 FCA programs on Archive.org via the internet.

VERIZON HD CHANNEL

Building on the success of our high-definition (HD) channel launch in 2023, Verizon FiOS 2139 and Comcast 1072 have received overwhelmingly positive feedback for their improved signal quality, which brings local content in line with the standards of other broad-

cast stations. This upgrade has been a significant milestone in our 40-year history, reflecting our commitment to delivering high-quality local programming. Our "best of" programming strategy has been well-received. It offers a curated selection of content that highlights the best of Foxborough's community events, educational programs, and government meetings. We continue to get positive feedback.

Despite the ongoing cord-cutting trend, our PEG channels and online platforms continue to attract strong viewership and engagement. Our expanding social media presence on YouTube, X, BlueSky, Threads, Instagram, and Facebook remains vibrant, with increasing numbers of viewers and community engagement.

We are grateful for the continued support from our community, Comcast, and Verizon, which has enabled us to maintain and enhance our services.

FCA RADIO

Dave Udden continues to prepare weekly local news which are also cablecast on the audio track of the Pub & Edu Channel. The new automated audio equipment allows him to expand the news format to include music, bumpers, channel ID's and really personalize the information with special holiday greetings from local personalities. The TIC Channel plays on Gov. Channel.

COMMUNITY BULLETIN BOARD

Announcements from local government agencies, educational institutions and regional non-profit organizations are cablecast daily, in addition to Activated Emergency Cancellations and Election Information.



Features LIVE coverage of regular and special meetings of the Foxborough School Committee continued since 2014. Programming from the US Department of Education and NASA is also cablecast, along with repeat playback of school sports and music programs. Classic Arts Showcase plays overnight daily. Public service announcements regarding Foxborough Public Schools and other area schools, The Boyden Library, and Foxborough YMCA are played around the clock.





Charlotte L. Altman 1940 - 2024
